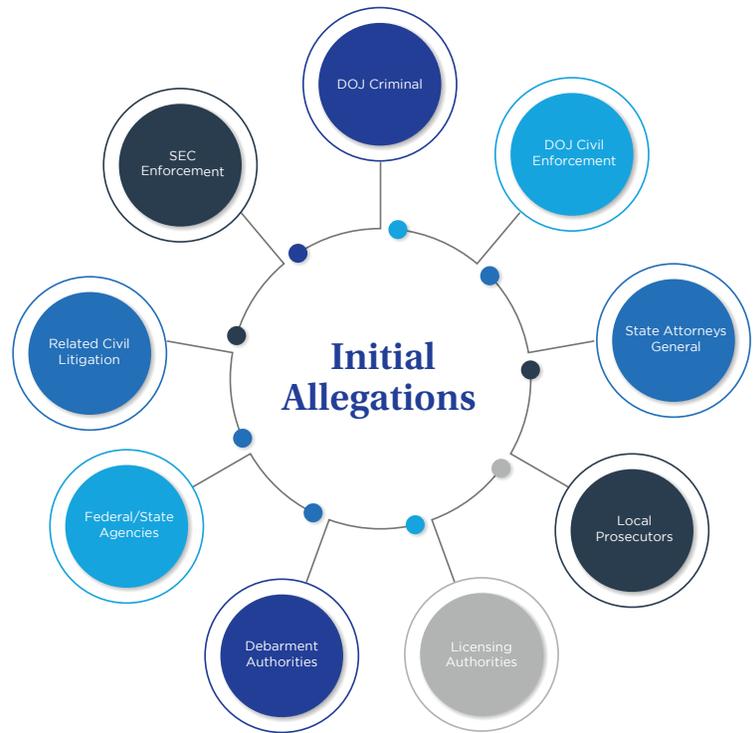

- Represent a chemical manufacturer in government investigations and a civil lawsuit regarding its alleged role in a chemical spill that created a toxic cloud over a center of population in eastern Kansas. Incident also resulted in indictments for violations of the Clean Air Act.
- Represent the court-appointed receiver in a case filed by the SEC alleging a \$345 million Ponzi scheme by three individuals.
